

## **Protective Factors Framework**


Families thrive when the Protective Factors are robust in their lives and communities. All of CAPC programs and services are built around the **Protective Factors Framework:** 



# The Economics of Abuse Report

### The Financial Impacts of Child Abuse

The cumulative financial impact to Contra Costa County for the 678 verified survivors of maltreatment and 2 maltreatment fatalities in 2021 is \$340,000,000. Though these costs are accrued over the course of the victim's life, the community will continue to occur the same cost each year until we are able to reduce and ultimately end child abuse.



### **CHILD WELFARE - \$55,259,039**

Victimes may require intervention services, foster care, and counseling services

### **EDUCATION - \$11,417,506**

Maltreated children are 77 percent more likely to require special education

#### **CRIMINAL JUSTICE - \$5,828,331**

Maltreated children are 59 percent more likely to be arrested as juveniles, and 28 percent more likely to have an adult criminal record.

#### HEALTHCARE - \$76,044,643

Victims may require hospital care, mental health services, and other medical services during childhood, and have a higher incidence of physical and mental health issues throughout adulthood.

#### **LIFETIME PRODUCTIVITY - \$186,680,677**


Victimes are more likely to be unemployed and rely on public assistance which lead to diminished earning potential

#### FATALITY - \$4,737,749


Accounts for the victims' lost wages and healthcare costs

# **Trainings/Events**

During fiscal year 2021/2022, CAPC provided 7 Community Education Workshops/Community Information Resource Events throughout Contra Costa County.

### **Parent Partner Program**

A success story I have is about a Mom that came to the attention of the department due to Domestic Violence and Substance Abuse. This Mom was very challenging in the beginning of her case. It didn't seem that she was going to make it due to her strong personality, entitlement and dislike for the department. The parents had been involved with Children and Family Services in two separate counties. They thought that being involved in Contra Costa County would be like the times before, but it wasn't. This time the parents really had to work hard to change their lives, as well as decide that being together wasn't the best. Mom realized this and went her separate way, and she got clean and sober.

As Mom got clean and sober she was able to attain a better understanding about keeping her daughter safe, and if that meant not being in a relationship with Dad then she wouldn't be in one. Mom also saw the importance of her safety and self-worth. On some occasions she felt alone, like nobody understood her struggles. Mom would reach out to her Parent Partner for support, just to talk, and her Parent Partner listened. After almost 18 months and some bumps in the road, Mom was able to maintain her sobriety

as she was able to hold down a job, take care of herself, be accountable for her part, and keep her daughter safe.

This Mom has had her child back in her care since October of 2021. Mom and the Parent Partner still talk on occasion - just a quick check in to say "Hi" and to provide additional resources or address concerns. Mom is still clean and sober and both child and Mom are happy. Unfortunately, Father still has some issues to work on, but tries to peacefully co-parent with Mother as they do live apart. This Mom has overcome so much to be successful.






# You Can Help Keep Kids Safe

### **Recognize Child Abuse:**

- » PHYSICAL ABUSE: Bodily injury inflicted non-accidentally on a child; willful cruelty, unjustifiable punishment, or corporal punishment causing a mark.
- » PHYSICAL NEGLECT: Not providing child adequate food, clothing, shelter, supervision or severely endangering child's health.
- » SEXUAL ABUSE: Victimization of a child through sexual activities, including molestation, indecent exposure, fondling, rape, pornography, sexual stimulation and incest.
- » EMOTIONAL ABUSE: Willfully causing a child to suffer by attacking self-esteem, constant criticism, yelling, belittling, insulting, rejecting or withholding love and support.
- » EXPLOITATION: Forcing or coercing child into activities beyond child's capabilities or that are illegal or degrading; including sexual exploitation.

### **Break the Cycle:**

- » Reach Out if **YOU** need support. Call a friend, hotline, or a prevention organization such as CAPC at (925) 798-0546.
- » Reach Out if **OTHERS** need support. Listen, offer to help with chores or childcare, or connect them with a local resource.
- » Reach Out to the **COMMUNITY**. Volunteer time at an organization. Donate. Learn about preventing child abuse & neglect. Wear the Blue Ribbon.
- » Reach Out & REPORT. Call 911 if there is immediate danger or call Contra Costa County Children & Family Services if you suspect child abuse at (877) 881-1116.
