

The Child Abuse Prevention Council (CAPC) identifies, builds, maintains, and coordinates a network of persons and agencies working in child abuse prevention and treatment, for the purpose of information sharing, referral, improvement of services, public education, family support, and advocacy.

All services are free. By calling or visiting the office you can:

- Obtain more information about child abuse and neglect in Contra Costa County.
- Learn how you can protect your children and what signs to look for in cases of possible abuse or neglect.
- Arrange for a speaker to talk to your community or professional group about preventing and reporting child abuse and neglect.
- Obtain free copies of Surviving Parenthood and a full range of other free, informational handouts and brochures.
- Receive information and referral services.

CAPC PROGRAMS

The Community Education Program

Persons working directly with children are mandated reporters and by law required to report suspected child abuse. Training on how to prevent child abuse and keep kids safe is offered at no cost to mandated reporters and to community members.

Child Help Speak Up and Be Safe (SUBS)

The school-based, child safety program addresses child abuse, bullying, cyber-bullying and sexual harassment prevention. Lessons are available for 1st-6th grade students.

Baby Bags

When new parents leave hospitals in Contra Costa County, we provide them with a baby bag with useful and important information about child development and child safety.

Nurturing Parenting Program

A comprehensive, research-based, culturally relevant parent education program for families with young children. The Nurturing Parenting Program addresses the Five Protective Factors that build on family strengths and promote optimal child development and reduces the risk factors associated with child abuse and neglect.

Parent/Youth Partners

Parent Partners serve as mentors to parents working through the child welfare system to reunite with their children and break-the-cycle of child abuse. Youth Partners mentor foster youth and provide support, education on their rights and responsibilities and resources to help facilitate favorable outcomes for these young persons. Our Mental Health Advocate connects parents and caregivers with appropriate mental health services for kids in their care and advocates to assure children's mental health needs are being met appropriately within the systems. Our Caregiver Liaison helps foster care placements be successful by connecting caretakers to resources in the community.

Sue Fleischner Special Needs Fund

Provides families with support and resources in an effort to reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect. Referrals to the Special Needs Fund are available to service providers working directly with families in need.

Telephone(925) 691-2300 The Regional Center of the East Bay (RCEB) is a private nonprofit corporation under contract with the California Department of Developmental Services. RCEB provides case management services, advocacy, client program planning, coordination of generic services, and consultation. RCEB may purchase needed services for clients based on policies established by our Board of Directors. State law, however, requires that alternate sources of funding i.e.: generic services such as medical private insurance, education, etc., be used before expenditure of Regional Center funds. An active client of the Regional Center must participate, at a minimum, in planning meetings to develop or revise an Individual Program Plan (IPP), or an Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) for a child under 3 years of age. An IPP identifies services and plans necessary for a client to achieve agreed upon objectives. Hours of Service: 8:30 AM-5:00 PM.

Languages spoken: Various, including, Spanish, ASL, Tagalog, Mandarin, Cantonese, Farsi, Vietnamese.

Cost of services: Fees may be charged when a family places a child under the age of 18 in an out-of-home placement. The fee for that service is required by the State based on a sliding scale determined by the Department of Developmental Services.

CHOOSING CHILD CARE

Finding a childcare situation to meet your specific needs may be a frustrating task. Affordable childcare, in a convenient location, with convenient hours, can be difficult to find. Very often there are long waiting lists...PLAN AHEAD.

AWARENESS IS KEY. Most childcare settings are safe and provide quality care. However, parents should take some precautionary measures:

- Visit the facility before you make a decision to send your child. Look at their license – note on the license the expiration date and how many children are allowed.
- Obtain a list of other parents with children in the center and call them for references.
- Find out the center's policies on discipline, naptime, toilet training, feeding, etc. Decide whether these policies are compatible with your own practices.
 CORPORAL PUNISHMENT IS ILLEGAL IN LICENSED CHILD-CARE FACILITIES.
- Make unannounced visits to the facility. Be suspicious if you are told you can only visit at certain times.
- Listen to what your child tells you about the childcare.
 Notice any sudden changes in your child's behavior.
- If you suspect a problem, share your concerns with other parents. Report suspicions of abuse or get more information from Children and Family Services or the police.
- To register or inquire about a complaint against a child care facility, call Community Care Licensing at (510) 622-2602.

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION, INTERVENTION AND TREATMENT SERVICES

If child assault or abuse occurs, various indicators can identify it. Notable signs of neglect, physical, sexual and emotional abuse include:

Neglect: Low birth weight, un-kept dirty appearance, lack of adequate medical and dental care, food, shelter and clothing, lack of caretaker or appropriate supervision.

Physical: Unexplained bruises, welts, burns, fractures, lacerations or abrasions, afraid to go home, fearful when other children cry.

Sexual: Venereal disease; pregnancy; difficulty walking or sitting; pain or itching in genital area; torn, stained or bloody underpants; fear of adults; runaway, infantile behavior; sophisticated or unusual sexual behavior or knowledge; may report sexual assault by parent, relative or caretaker.

Emotional: Failure-to-thrive; speech disorders; bed-wetting; nightmares; learning disabilities; withdrawal. Passive or aggressive behavior; poor peer relationships; delay in social, physical or emotional development.

In cases of child abuse or assault, BE CALM.
BELIEVE your child; get the facts of the incident.
Assure your child that what has happened IS NOT her/his
fault. Tell the child what you plan to do. Get appropriate
outside help.

The intake of alcohol and drugs while pregnant can cause birth defects (i.e. brain damage, low birth weight, fetal alcohol syndrome, etc.) Babies born with infant drug addiction must subsequently undergo drug withdrawal. These babies are difficult to care for and, consequently, are at high risk for child abuse. Alcohol/drug abuse can also cause premature births, miscarriages, and tends to increase a baby's risk for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS).
