CHILDHELP SPEAK UP BE SAFE

- Evidence-based primary prevention curriculum aimed at stopping and preventing child abuse (including Human Trafficking in 8th grade)
- Developmentally appropriate curriculum 1st through 8th grade
- Based on research: child development, learning styles, social psychology, and child abuse and neglect prevention

HOW IT WORKS

- Two interactive and engaging lessons per grade, taught by classroom
- 35 60 minutes for each lesson
- 5th and 6th grades receive sexual harassment prevention as part of their lessons
- · Reinforcement activities for every grade
- Consent forms and lesson review for parents/ caregivers

TEACHES CHILDREN

- How to identify unsafe situations
- · How to identify safe adults
- · How to talk to safe adults
- 5 key safety rules (age appropriate)

CURRICULUM BIG IDEAS

Every lesson (across all grade levels) reinforces same primary ideas through age-appropriate instruction and interaction

- · Safety is important
- · You deserve to be safe
- Child safety is an adult's responsibility
 - In 8th grade curriculum, this idea evolves into an adult-adolescent shared responsibility
- · There are safe adults
- You need to know safety rules
- RESIST strategies can help
